13 incidents of which one did not involve crime, and two were thefts that occurred within premises. CCTV could have provided some information in relation to the remaining ten incidents, although in one case CCTV installed within a premises was sufficient to provide a lead. Of these ten incidents, five were serious (housebreakings and assault), while the remaining five were petty crimes.

No location was given for these 17 incidents, although they could, conceivably have occurred on the High St. Five involved shoplifting, so occurred within premises. With the exception of the assault, the other incidents are petty crimes.

Dec 2020 42 crimes in the Biggar, Symington and Thankerton area between 10/9/20 and 10/12/20 including sexual offences and assaults, but mainly thefts and road traffic incidents. Unclear where within the area these took place, and whether any were on Biggar High St. Police have emphasised that sexual offences and assaults often take place within households.
